

# Internet Explorer DOWNLOADING FILES

Downloading files from the Internet is easy if you know what you're doing. However, if you're using Windows XP, that program — combined with Internet Explorer — will try to protect you, so you need to follow these instructions to download a file.

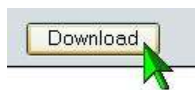

1. Sometimes a program will offer you a download button (Figure 1), so you'll click on it. However, most of the time, you'll have to select to download (Figure 2):

- 1 RIGHT-click on the file.
- 2 Left-click on "Save Target as..."

2. If the download option in Step 3 does not appear, look under your Address Bar (where the address is typed) and:

- 1 Left-click on that blue line of text.
- 2 Left-click on "Download File..."

3. In the "File Download" window, Left-click on the "Save" button (Figure 4).

4. A download progress window will appear showing progress (Figure 5). Click on the option to make it disappear when the download is complete.
