## SAVE A MOVIE

Once you have created a film project, you are not done yet. Until you save it, you may not share it. Here's how to save it.

1. After you select Start ► All Programs ► Adobe Photoshop Elements 3.0. or double, left-click on its Desktop shortcut, the selection window appears. Click on "Make Photo Creation" — the second choice from the right (**Figure 1**).

2. Creation Setup appears (**Figure 2**):

- ❶ "Slide Show" should be highlighted. However, you have already made the contents for the slide show, so...
- ❷ Click on "Cancel" button.

3. From the MenuBar, select File ► Open Creation (**Figure 3**).

4. Select the show upon which you've been working and click on "OK" button (**Figure 4**).

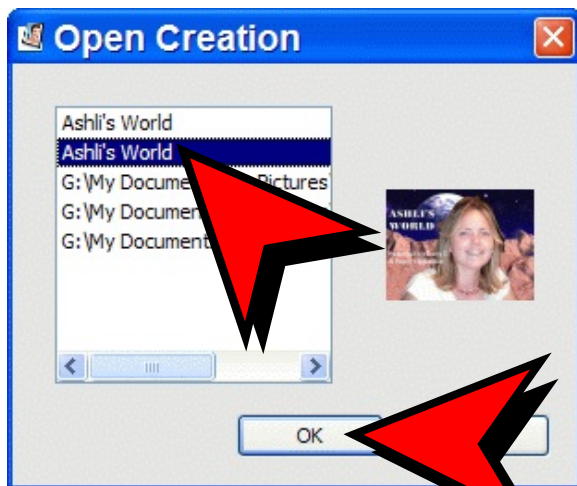

5. In the resulting screen, select File ► Save As WMF (**Figure 5**).

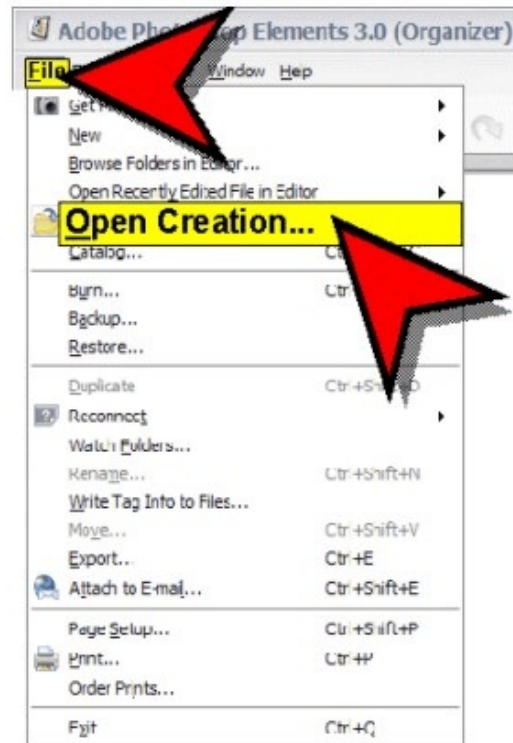

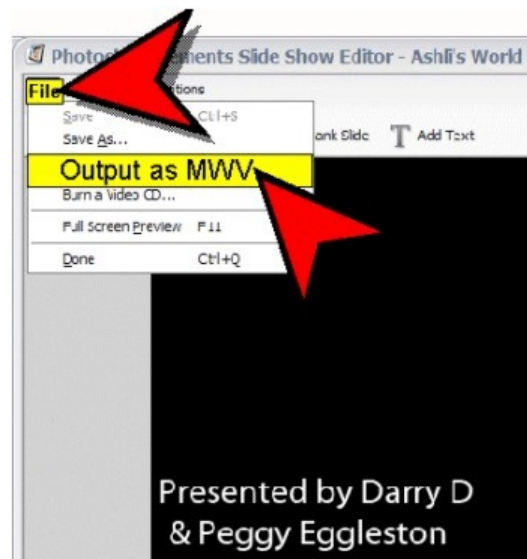

6. In the next screen, click "OK" button (**Figure 6**).

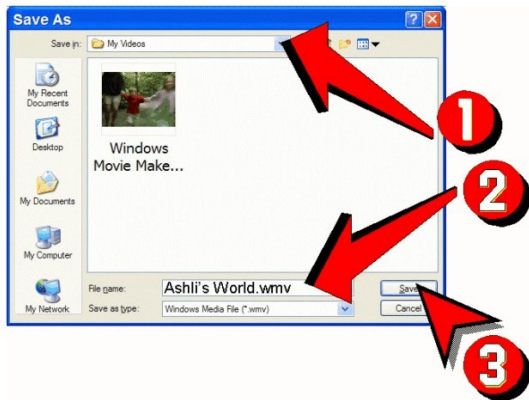

7. In the "Save As" window (**Figure 7**):

- ❶ The folder into which it will be saved shows.
- ❷ The name is shown; but you can change it at this point.
- ❸ Click on the "Save" button.
