1. Open a photo (**Figure 1**).
2. From the MenuBar, select Filter ► Sketch ► Photocopy (**Figure 2**).

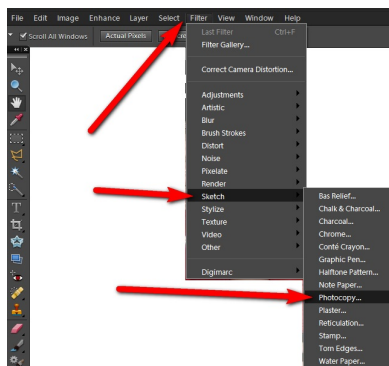

4. Add several photos together, and you've got a great coloring book.

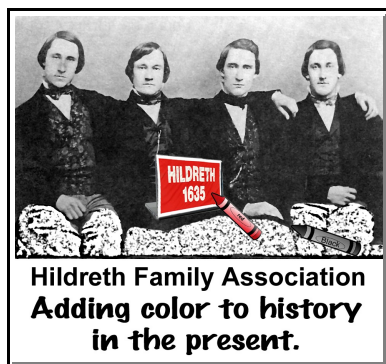

3. In the Photocopy menu, you'll get two slider bars: Detail and Darkness. Drag the sliders over till satisfied (**Figure 3**).

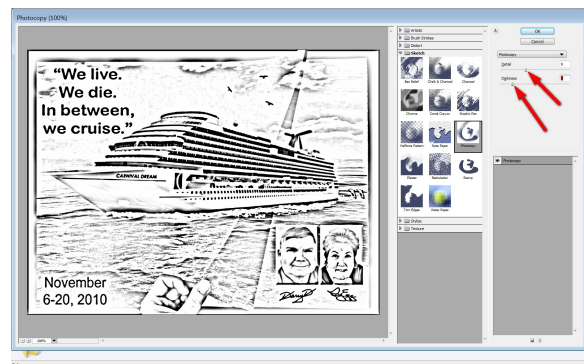
