One of the challenges of editing photos has always been that if you zoom in for a closer view and make changes, you have to zoom out to see what the effect on that smaller area has upon the larger whole. Elements solves the problem with this tool.

Here's how to use it.

1. Open the photo that you want to edit (Figure 1).

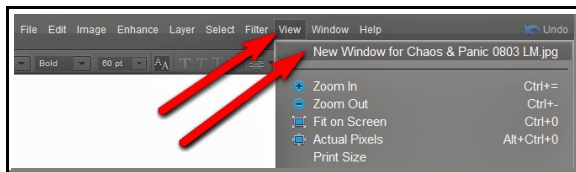

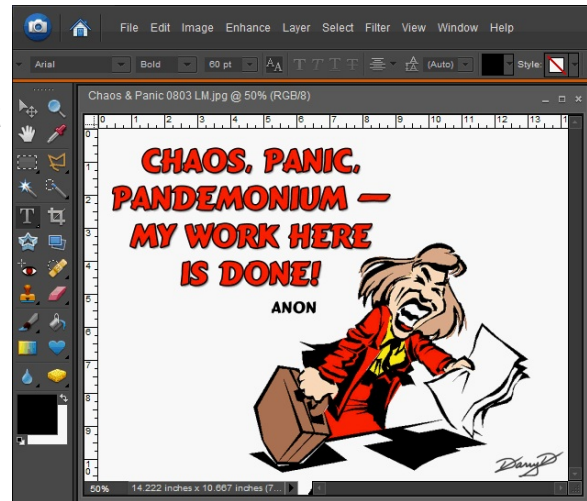

2. From the MenuBar, select View ► New Window for [name of photo].

3. Since the New Window maintains the full view, whatever changes you make — even when you zoom in (Figure 3) — are instantly shown in the New Window.

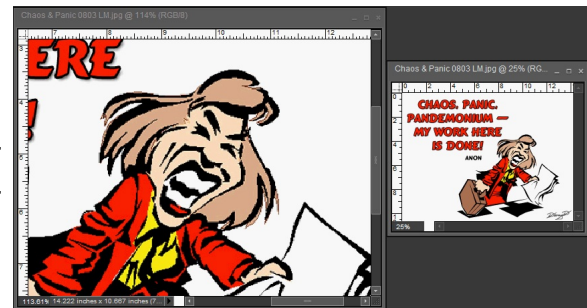
