One of the advantages of Windows Live Messenger is that you can make video calls using webcams. The advantages of this is that you can not only see each other, but you can show items to each other.

Here's how to make a video call.

1. After you open Windows Live Messenger (Figure 1):

- 1 Left-click on the Contact you want to call.
- 2 From the MenuBar, Left-click on 'Actions...'
- 3 Left-click on 'Video...'
- 4 Left-click on 'Start a Video Call...'

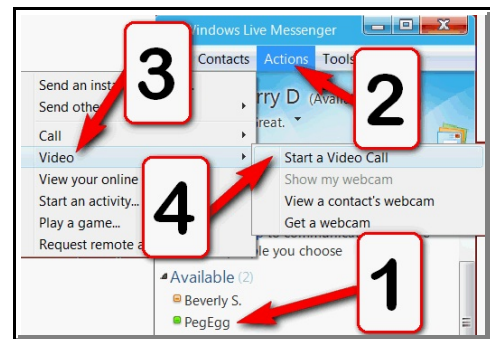
