There are many ways to rename your photos in Photoshop Elements. This is one of the most effective ways. Here's how to do it.

1. After you've selected Start > My Pictures and maneuvered to the photo (Figure 1):

- 1 RIGHT-click on the photo's name.
- 2 Left-click on "Properties" — the last item in the drop-down menu.

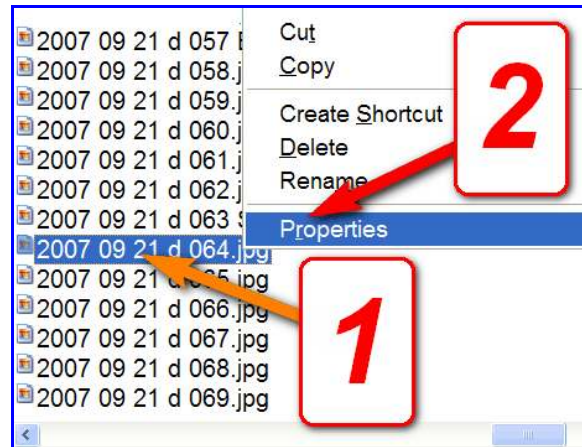

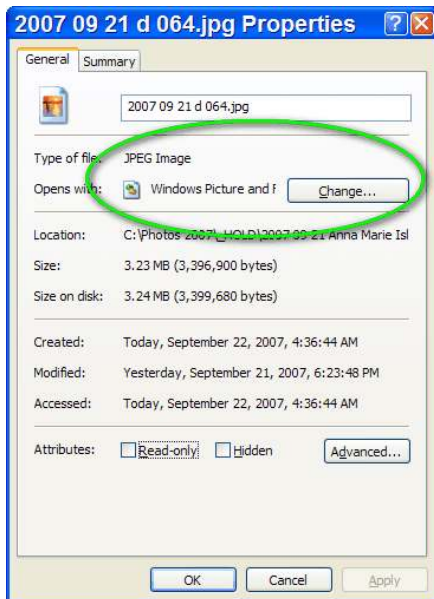

2. Next to the "Opens with:" line (Figure 2), Left-click on the "Change" button.

3. Double, left-click on the photo to preview it (**Figure 3**).

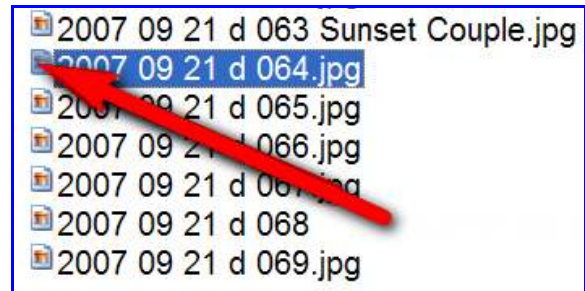

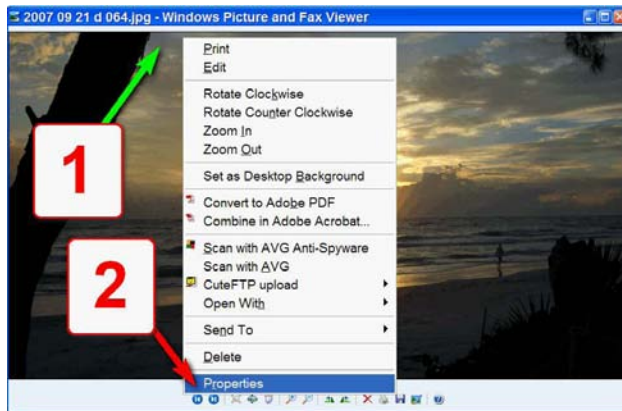

4. To change the name (**Figure 4**):
 ① RIGHT-click on the photo.
 ② Left-click on “Properties” — the last option in the drop-down menu.

5. Left-click on the file name (**Figure 5**), to the right of the photo number but to the left of the dot in ‘.JPG’.

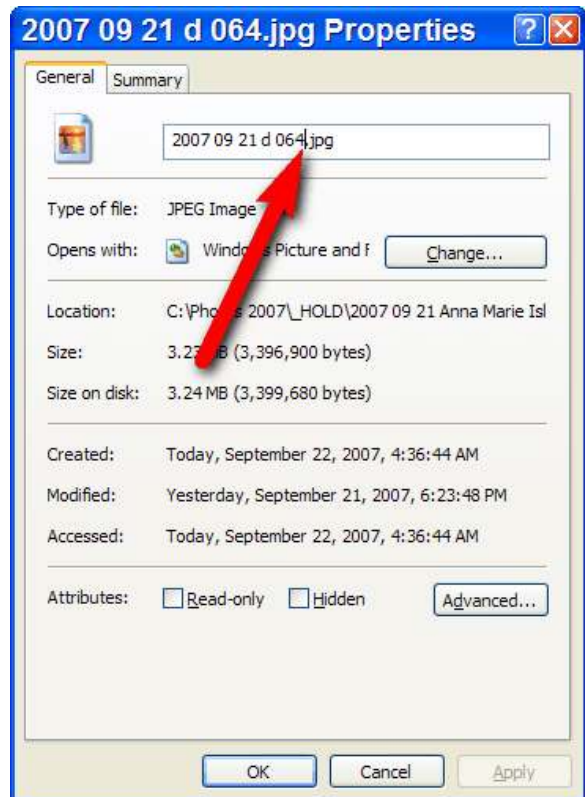

6. In the new window (**Figure 6**):

❶ Touch the Spacebar, on the keyboard, and type the name for the photo.

WARNING: Ensure you leave the “.jpg” at the end of the file name.

❷ Touch the *Enter* key, on the keyboard, or click on the “OK” button.

7. A “No Preview” window will appear (**Figure 7**), but just Left-click on the “X” in the upper-right corner to exit the view.

8. The file name you changed is highlighted (**Figure 8**), showing the new name you gave it.

Compare this figure with Figure 3 to see the difference.

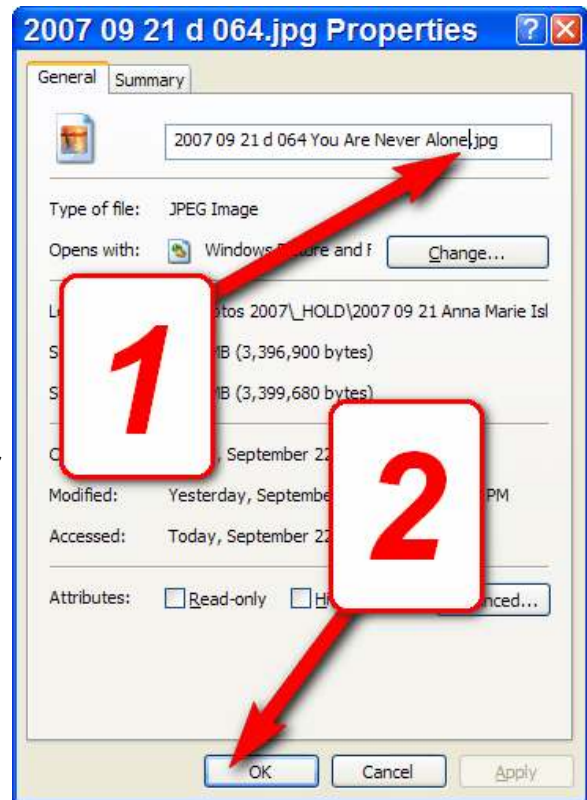

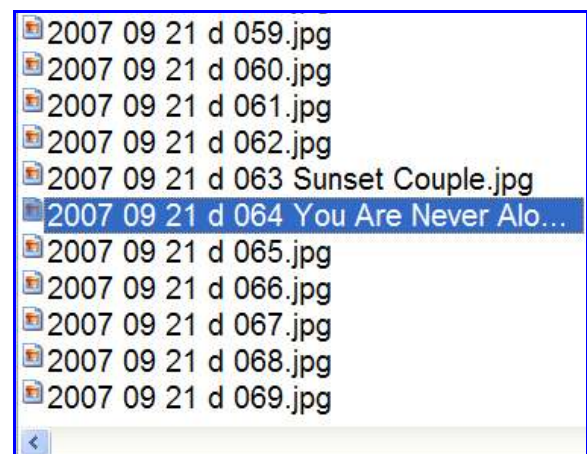

9. If you Double, left-click on the file name, you'll see the photo (**Figure 9**), with the name you gave it in Step 6 at the top of the window.
